Rules for the Guidance of Judges, Stewards and Exhibitors

- 1. The Judges are at liberty to cut or taste fruit, vegetables or produce and their decision in all cases as to the merit of any entry is final.
- 2. In all cases of disqualification or non-award, judges are to write on their list the reason for disqualification or non-award.
- 3. All fruit and vegetables must be judged according to their fitness for use.
- 4. Foliage plants are understood to be any plants not grown for flowers.
- 5. Names of exhibits are not to be considered except in deciding when points are otherwise equal.
- 6. All vegetables to be exhibited must be cleaned and all root exhibits must have their tap roots left entire.
- 7. Judges are requested to note that ONLY ONE FIRST PRIZE MAY BE AWARDED IN ANY ONE CLASS.
- 8. The Committee reserves the right to grade any Exhibitor.
- 9. All garden exhibits with the exception of floral art are to be grown and owned by the Exhibitor.
- 10. Judges and Stewards are responsible for reading and monitoring these rules

Definitions

A NOVICE is one who has never won a points prize in a novice section more than three times.

AN EXHIBITOR is still a Novice if there has been no competition in that section in an earlier show.
